Anastasia Soroczynski: Writing Thru Dance



Ms. Anastasia Soroczynski has over 18 years experience with RIOULT Dance NY, 15 of which were as the primary dancer. After RIOULT disbanded due to COVID, Ms. Anastasia has transitioned to primarily supporting in-school programming in NYC as well as teaching domestically internationally, and is an Educational Consultant for several NYC Dance Companies.

Writing Thru Dance encourages students to explore dance as a form of communication through the integration of writing and movement activities. Participating classes can either take a story already written or write their own story. Kindergarten classes learn through fables. First graders are given a writing prompt and then use the prompt to create improvised dance and movement pieces. Recent themes have included the seasons.

Karen Domingo-Moran: kidspire





Karen Domingo-Moran's formal study of architecture began when she entered Cooper Union's undergraduate program at the age of 16. After receiving her Bachelor of Architecture degree, Karen focused her career on large scale public projects within New York City.

Her career highlights have included working on the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey's AirTrain to JFK; JFK's Terminal One Design Competition; NYC's public school modernizations, and subway station renovations. Like most parents, starting a family completely changed Karen's life. The seeds of Kidspire started to develop when Karen volunteered to teach architecture and design at her eldest child's school.

Karen Domingo-Moran: kidspire





Kidspire offers an exciting educational enrichment program that inspires young minds to visualize, draw, and construct through fun hands-on architecture and design projects. Children will develop skills of observation, problem solving, critical thinking, spatial reasoning, and self-expression that are important to their success in all subjects.

We explore architecture and design from different cultures worldwide (Africa, Middle East, China, South East Asia, Europe, and the Americas) and immerse students in project-based learning with art and 2D-3D design challenges and integrated STEAM lessons. Thus, building connections with their curriculum, community, and cultures everywhere while developing lifelong learning skills.

Karen Domingo-Moran: kidspire

Tom Moran: kidspire





Tom Moran developed the Move One Chess program after successfully teaching chess throughout the city for several years! He gained extensive classroom experience with Title 1 schools in Harlem, Brooklyn, Queens and the Bronx while working for Chess-in the-Schools. He is also a USCF Certified Chess Coach, level 3.

He teaches children not to be afraid to make mistakes but see them as learning opportunities. Through chess, Tom teaches **creative problem solving, memory, foresight, focus, mental fortitude, and sportsmanship**; skills they can take from the board and apply to the rest of their lives.

Tom Moran: kidspire





Move One Chess introduces children to the enormous academic and life skill benefits of playing chess. Chess has been shown to increase children's mental aptitudes for the future. As children are having fun and making friends, they are increasing their concentration, self-discipline, and spatial reasoning capacities as well as bolstering both intellectual and social abilities.

Learning chess improves math and reading readiness and reinforces the benefits of listening and following directions as well as creative problem solving. Our goal is to make learning chess enjoyable and approachable so that children will reap the benefits of the skills they develop, and the love of the game, for many years to come!



He began his formal dance training in 1987 under the supervision of one of the most prestigious teachers in Haiti and has toured the world during his 8 years performing in the National Dance Theatre including performances in Venezuela, Paris, Hungary, Japan, Germany, Montreal, Santo-Domingo and the United State.





Enrichment Committee Report Peniel Guerrier

Peniel's vision has different aspects, but the most important is to establish and extend the Haitian folkloric structure and technique. Peniel draws on his extensive knowledge of Haitian folkloric dance to create original combinations within the different traditional Haitian rhythms.

His dances enhance the energy and flow of traditional forms with beautiful, vivid body shapes. Peniel is highly regarded as a teacher because of his thoroughness, his kindness, and the individual attention he gives to students of all levels.

Throughout his program, Peniel not only teaches an appreciation of dance, rhythm and an understanding of Haitian culture, but also provides an introduction to the concepts of teamwork and cooperation.

Alongside the online auction, we feel an in-person event will help us reach our greatest potential in raising funds.

After much venue research and cost considerations, the auction committee has chosen the local restaurant, **Sala**, as our proposed space.
